MiCLU works with immigration lawyers and other professionals to improve their understanding of how children's rights law can be used in immigration cases to significantly improve outcomes for children. We seek to promote best practise across the sector. We also provide specialist support, information and training to Local Authorities, children's charities and other NGOs and civil society groups.

We aim for all these actors to hear the voice of the young person through their active participation in events, research and the creation of resources. These agencies can then use their enhanced knowledge to identify legal issues and get the right support for their clients, and to shape their own support programmes and influencing strategies.

At the same time MiCLU aim to build knowledge and skills among and across communities of young migrants through training, through facilitation of peer-to-peer learning, and through participation in activities that empower them to advocate for themselves in a safe environment.

BUILDING CROSS-SECTORAL LINKS



MiCLU plays a brokering and information exchange role both within and across sectors, working together with legal professionals, statutory and non-statutory agencies (including Children's Commissioners', Committees and Inspectorates), Local Authorities, academics, health care professionals and civil society actors - acting as a bridge between them to help encourage better working relationships and share best practice and evidence locally, regionally and nationally. MiCLU seeks to work with others to widen the debate on children's rights and strengthen child protection networks, and to help multiply and amplify voices of the children and young poeple
